What did we do to fight corruption in 2022?

Analysis and assessment of the corruption landscape

- We published the Corruption
 Perceptions Index for the 28th time,
 which indicates the perceived level of public sector corruption.
- In the second edition of the Black
 Book, we summarized and assessed the
 Hungarian corruption landscape
 between 2018 and 2022. As part of
 International Anti-Corruption Day, the
 most striking cases were presented in a
 play on December 9th.

Cooperation with NGOs

- Together with other Hungarian
 NGOs, we have been monitoring the misuse of EU funds and also the rule-of-law situation in Hungary.
- We prepared shadow reports and published evaluations for European Commission reports.

Promoting freedom of information

- In a framework of a research project, we mapped the freedom of information practices at home and abroad.
- In 2022, we also submitted ten new FOI requests, five of which were referred to the court.
- In total, we **won six lawsuits** filed in previous years at the Curia of Hungary.

Monitoring public funds

- We compiled and published a study about irregularities discovered regarding grants to the tourism sector which were also presented as a **photo** exhibition at the Sziget Festival.
- In the framework of the Integrity Pacts we monitored two EU and three municipal projects.

Supporting investigative journalism

- Our Mentor-Mentee Program on Investigative Journalism for young journalists has been organised for the 10th time in 2022.
- Transparency-Soma Prize for investigative journalism awarded to a series of articles, which revealed the story behind the planned construction of the Chinese Fudan University campus in Budapest.

Fostering civic engagement

- Together with three municipalities, and with the active participation of local residents, we implemented community budget programs.
- We continued to receive a high number of whistleblower reports about corruption.
